Rumster Hill Climb

Caithness Car Club was formed in 1955 to specifically run motorsport events in the North of Scotland. The club is more known in the sprinting scene, but it did once run one of the

most notorious hillclimbs - Rumster.

Unfortunately the Forestry Commission used the tarmac for access when tree felling and destroyed the track. Caithness Car Club surrendered the track license and the hill dropped off the championship. However, as of 2023, the committee are working hard to try and resurrect the hill climb at Rumster and its hoped it might once again, provide more thrills in years
