Administrative history: Collection of blank unaddressed postcards

featuring black and white photographs of Caithness, with a particular focus on Latheronwheel, Dunbeath and Wick.

Postcards produced by either Tuck's Post Cards, J.B. White Ltd., Valentine's or have no discernible

publisher.

J.B. White Ltd. began publishing their 'real photograph' postcards in 1922, with the photographs being taken by James White's son, Thomas, and the primary subject matter being Scotland. Thomas would develop and print his own photographs with retouches being completed by in-house postcard artist, James Hutton. Once the photographs were retouched they were sent to Rotary Photographic Co Ltd. in London, where they were re-photographed and made into

postcard size negatives that were printed 16 at a

time.

Raphael Tuck and Sons created their first set of Tuck Post Cards in 1899. It was a set of 12 consecutively numbered chromographic views of London. As a general rule they sold their cards in sets of six. By the end of 1903 Tuck had in production over 10,000 different cards and by

1904 it was 15,000.

The Tuck's Post cards containing images of Caithness were produced roughly between 1935 to 1945, however, this is only an estimated time period as Tuck Post Cards are notorious for having no dates and no discernible clear

Valentines of Dundee was founded in 1851 by James Valentine. In 1879 after his passing his two sons William and George Dobson Valentine took over the business, with William deciding in 1898 to enter the picture postcard market. By 1900 they employed a staff of photographers who worked on location from spring until early autumn and then spent the rest of the year processing the results. The 1950s saw the firm begin to wane and after July 1966 no new monochrome views were registered.

Valentine's postcard 96511 was registered in 1925.
