Administrative history: Wick Academy Football Club

Wick Academy Football Club was founded in October 1893, taking its name from the cricket club which had been in existence for about 20

vears.

The teams home ground is the Harmsworth Park in Wick and the supporters are known as "Scorries" (hence the publication *Scorrie*

Scene).

Hamilton's Auction Marts

Hamilton's Auction Marts were situated in Ormlie Road, Thurso, and opened for business on 28 March 1923. They also had premises in Lybster and Forsinard. It continued business as a livestock auctioneering company until c.1995 when it became Hamilton's & UA Partnership

Ltd.

Aberdeen and Northern Marts

Aberdeen and Northern Marts, Caithness Livestock Centre is located on Quoybrae Farm

(2024) and has been since 1992.

The centre, which has a reputation for showing

high quality livestock, offers a complete livestock marketing service for Caithness farmers, with a series of seasonal sales for Store and Breeding Stock. During September the sale of North Country Cheviot lambs attracts an entry of around 6,000 heads.

Caithness Agricultural Society

Caithness Agricultural Society was established in 1830 "To promote for the benefit of the public agriculture and rural industries in Caithness and in furtherance therof". The annual summer show has been a feature of Caithness life since this time. The show usually takes place on the 3rd Saturday in July and alternates venues between the Riverside and Westerseat grounds in Wick and Thurso East in Thurso.

Halkirk Highland Games

The John O'Groat Journal, dated 22 September 1886, reported that the first Games started by the Halkirk Athletic Club was held in a field adjoining the new Gerston Distillery on Saturday 16th September. The Committee was 10 strong and the President and Secretary were Messrs H J MacKay and William Paterson respectively.16 events were staged as follows;21lb ball, 16lb hammer, running high leap, vaulting with pole, standing jump, running long jump, hop step & leap, 100 yards, quarter mile, one mile open and confined to Parish, 3 legged race, obstacle race, sack race, highland fling, tug o' war (married versus single).

The next Games were held in a field near the Hoy railway station and they continued to be staged there until the outbreak of the First World War. The day was changed to a Monday so that it coincided with the Thurso shopkeepers' holiday and the "townies" travelled to the Games by train.

The Games moved to its current location in 1921 and is still staged there as of 2024.

Wick MADD Society

The Wick MADD (Music, Art, Drama and Dance) Society was formed in January 1997, with its aim being to promote the arts amongst young people within the community. Throughout its years they put on various productions and performed at local events and festivals.

Wick Players

Wick Players was formed in 1932, following a meeting called by new County Librarian Kennedy Stewart. The first show was

performed in December of that year in the Breadalbane Hall.

The players joined the SCDA (Scottish Community Drama Association) in order to compete with other amateur dramatics groups around Scotland.

Wick Players celebrated their 90th anniversary in 2023.

Thurso Players

Thurso Players was formed in 1950 following the demise of the Thurso Dramatic Society, Thurso Dramatic Club and earlier Caithness drama groups that can be traced back to the 1890s.

Despite the logistical problems of finding rehearsal and performance spaces the Players thrived, and in 1959 founder member Robin Sinclair offered a building in the old mill complex to the club – if they could make it safe and watertight.
